Dear Parish Family,

April brings us not only warmer weather but also the spiritual intensity of Holy Week and Easter. It's also time for spring cleaning! Yesterday, in the spirit of cleaning/organizing, I dropped off a pair of old eyeglasses at the library, so that they might be used by The Lions Club for a person in the developing world who needs glasses. Not only did I feel good as a steward of an expensive pair of glasses, but it made me think about the purpose of the cycle of Holy Week and Easter as an exercise in gaining clarity of vision...spiritual, that is!

Who is Jesus Christ for each of us? Is he the crucified Jesus on the cross? Is he the glorious risen Christ greeting the women at the tomb? The many thoughts and feelings of Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and then Easter morning can easily blur our image and diminish the clarity of who our Savior is for each of us. Seen through the lens of love, however, Jesus Christ, becomes a very sharp and clear image! Our own Alice Lanigan, (R.I.P. 2016) quoted John 3:16: 'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.' God's love sent Jesus to live and die as one of us, and in the words of the Eucharistic prayer, made us worthy to stand before God.

Try on the spiritual lens of Holy Week and Easter! Strengthen your vision by worshipping with a congregation also working to gain clarity of vision. Invite a friend who is also seeking to bring an old story into focus in 2019. I think that as you walk the way of Holy Week that it takes seeing Jesus through all the events of the week that changed the world. The resurrected Christ becomes clear and bright only by doing this hard work!

May you have a meaningful season ahead!

Practices for Jesus-Centered Life

- TURN** Pause, listen, and choose to follow Jesus
- LEARN** Reflect on Scripture each day, especially Jesus' life and teachings
- PRAY** Dwell intentionally with God each day
- WORSHIP** Gather in community weekly to thank, praise, and draw near God
- BLESS** Share faith and unselfishly give and serve
- GO** Cross boundaries, listen deeply, and live like Jesus
- REST** Receive the gift of God's grace, peace, and restoration

At the Tuesday night Lenten Classes a group of 10± have been focusing on **The Way of Love**, by reading *Living The Way of Love: a 40 Day Devotional* by Mary Bea Sullivan. Along with reading daily devotions throughout Lent, we are invited to create a rule of life – a framework on which to build a Jesus-centered life through the seven practices listed above. We have read devotions about listening, different models of prayer, stress, community, great love, and great loss. We have shared with each other how those devotions and the suggested ways to reflect upon them have been comfortable and uncomfortable. And, of course, we have shared food and laughter!
