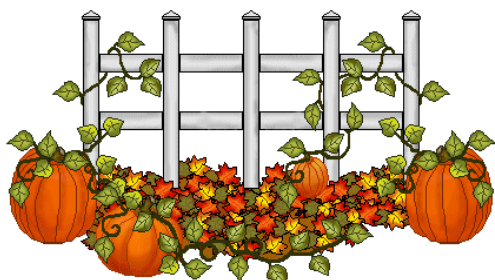
## Time Capsule part of our Construction

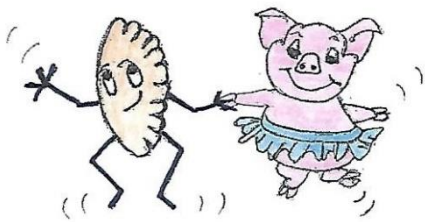
